Item	Discussion	Action
1	Ground floor and external/community interacting program	
	 Public Health did not have a requirement that its program needed ground floor presence, although it would be preferred for program that has direct research subject interaction – such as the Social Sciences Interview Suite. 	
	 During the meeting, sharing of the Social Sciences Interview Suite with Psychology was discussed, and confirmed acceptable. The Social Sciences Interview Suite should be located on the main public entry level. 	
	- Social Sciences Research Labs do not have direct public interaction and therefore not required on the ground floor.	
	 Wet Labs and Computational Labs are not to be accessible to the public. 	
	- PH is very interested in having their labs grouped together to build a sense of community. The ANR Nutritional Lab will have test subjects come to the lab but PH would prefer to have the Nutritional Lab grouped together with their other labs rather than to have it located on the 1st floor with the Social Sciences Interview Suite.

	- "Dean Suite" (Admin workstations (12), Admin offices (10) and Deans office (8)), to understand the spaces their relationship with each other and the rest of the administrative spaces.	
	- Graduate Workstations (4) , to clarify the users and its connection to other spaces relating to graduate students needs.	
	 Large computer lab (29) – formerly labeled as "Large Seminar Room", to understand its use and flexibility. This is a large room and PH have requested for 2 labs as opposed to 1. 	
3	 Computational Labs (51), to understand the breakup of this space/allocated area. They were formerly labelled as shared spaces but we now understand these are individual to departments. 	
	 Wet Labs (58), to understand the privacy needed for this space. SCB have been informed by UCM that this is a secure location and should not be accessed by the public. 	
4	Reception (general topic) - A subject of discussion, from PH's perspective, is how guests are greeted upon arrival. A shared reception for the building or a workstation within HSRI space warrants further discussions.	
5	TA/Hoteling Space (7) This space has been outlined as a shared space in the matrix but is in fact a shared space only between Public Health and Psychology.	UCM – Maggie or Allison to confirm
6	Waiting Areas Waiting areas are not designated for PH in the matrix, (only in the Social Sciences Interview Suite (and for #57, the PH Reception/Waiting Area) however a zone or area where people can situate themselves would be ideal for students, staff and visitors to avoid users using corridors or other spaces as make shift waiting areas.	
7	Social Science Interview Suite - Per PH, this space is to be shared with Psychology. Who manages this space? Is it a core space, or overseen by one department?	UCM – Maggie or Allison to confirm


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
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PUBLIC HEALTH ADJACENCY DIAGRAM
